

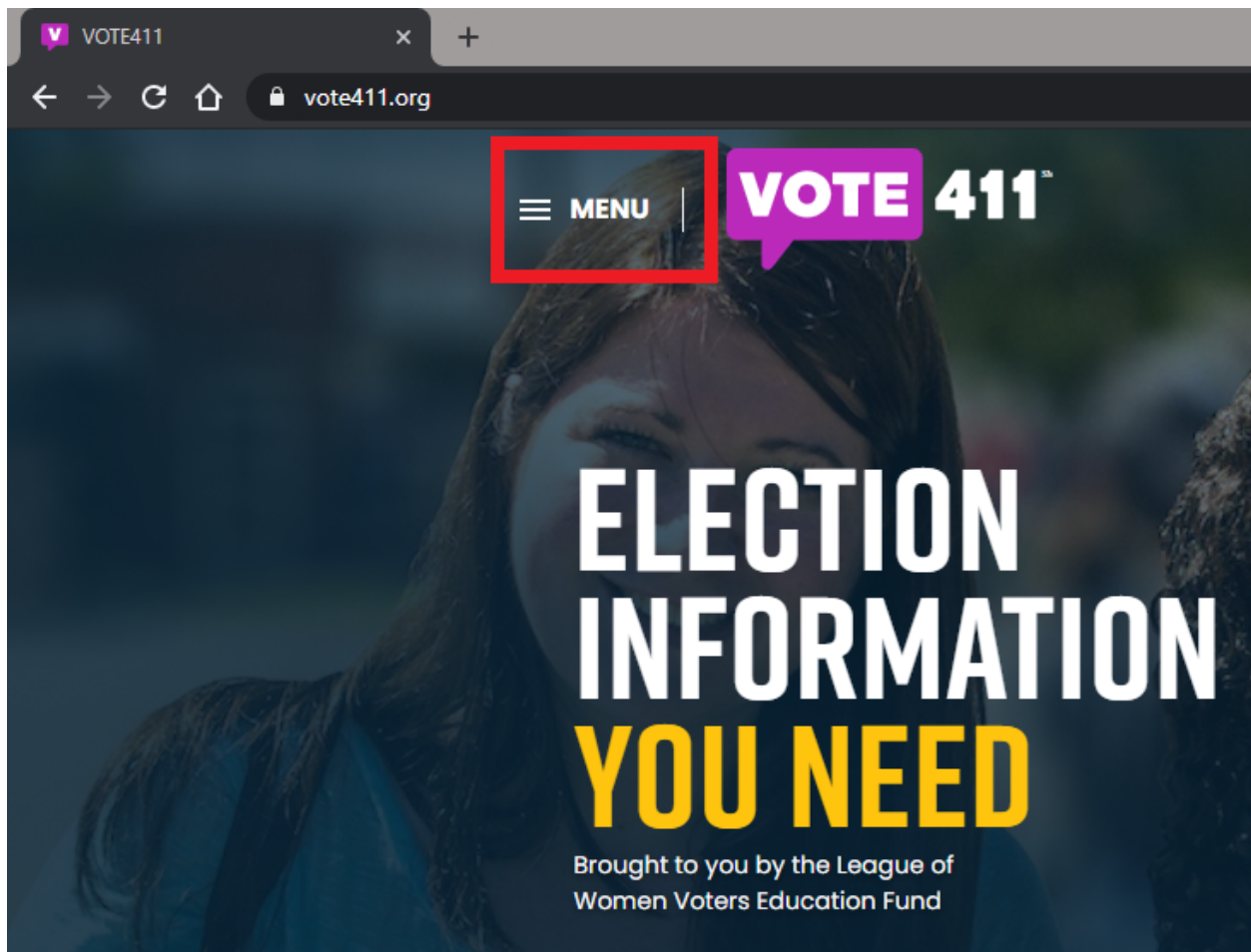
How to find an election in VOTE411 – Texas May 1, 2021 Local Political Subdivisions Edition

The example used is an “election” or “race” page voters in Denton County see at the end of their guide.

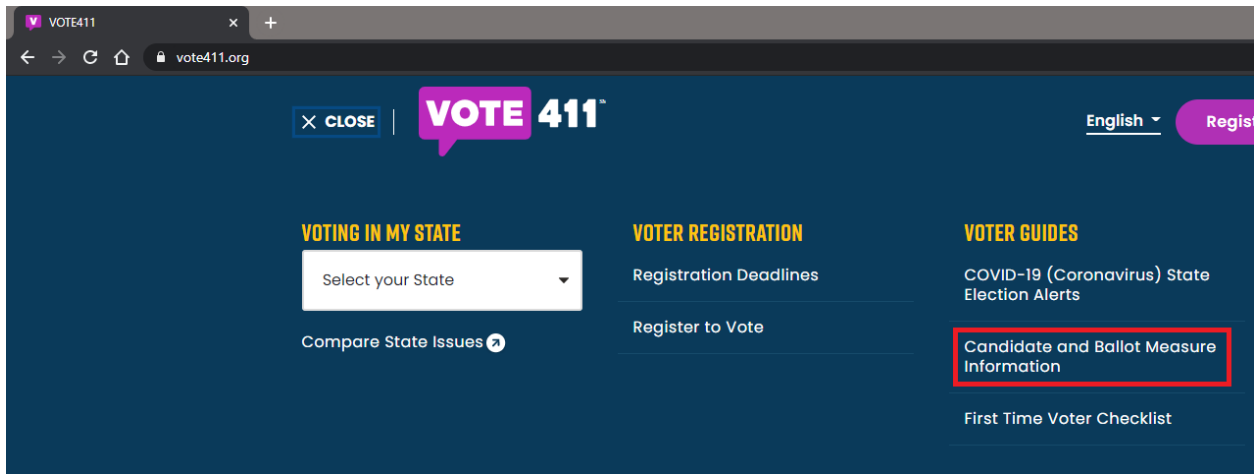
Google Chrome was used for screen shots.

1. Start at <https://www.vote411.org/>
2. Click on the three bars MENU



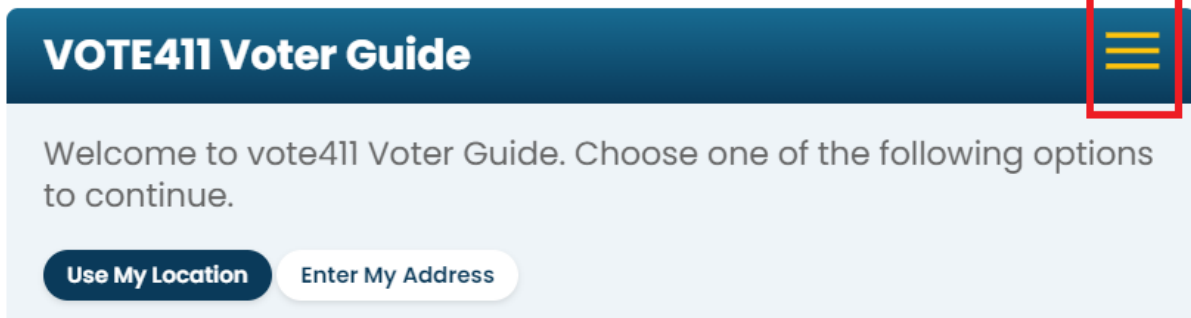
3. A drop down appears. Click “Candidate and Ballot Measure Information”



4. You should be at this page <https://www.vote411.org/ballot> now

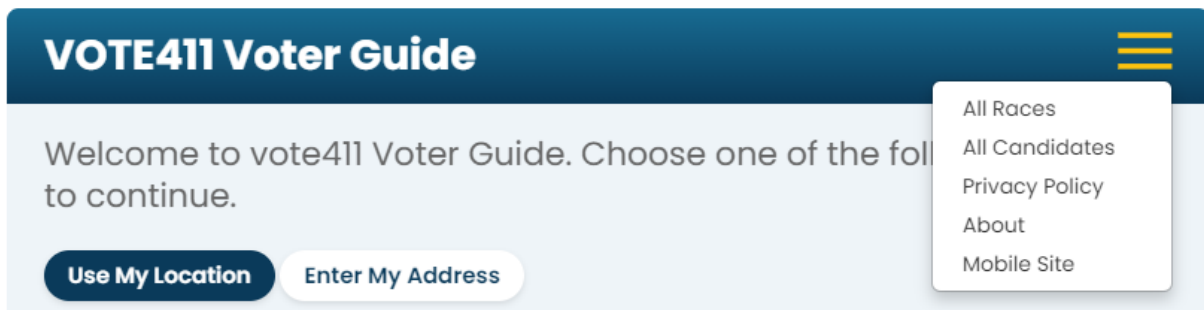
5. Click on the three yellow bars

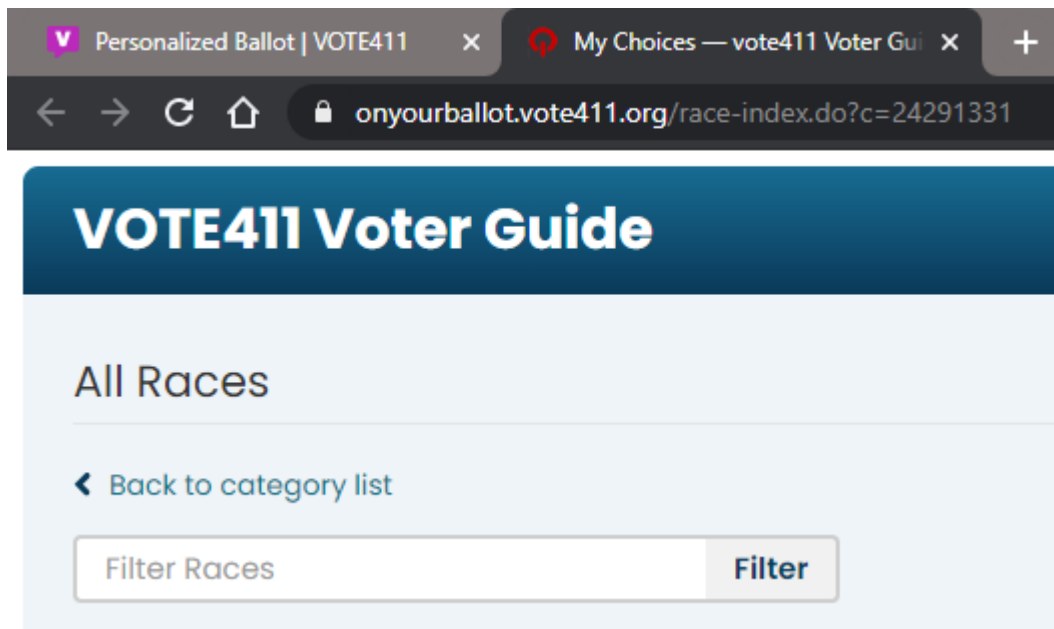


6. Select “All Races”

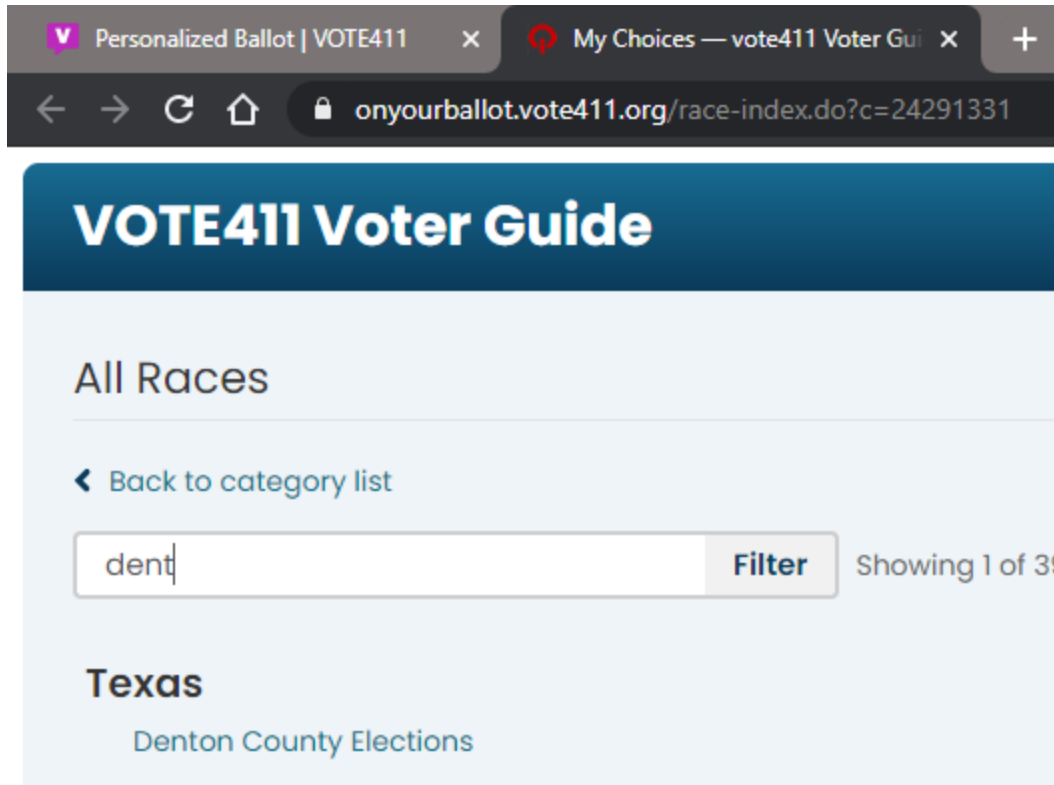

10. Use the Filter Races to find a particular race. In the example you are looking for Denton County Elections



11. Using the filter does not require capitalization. Users may not have to type the entire Race Name for desired results as illustrated below.



12. OPTIONAL: Right click on Texas to open the link in a new tab or new window or to copy the link URL.
